#### ORDINANCE NO. 1190

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAMAR, COLORADO, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS WATER **ACTIVITY** ENTERPRISE, AUTHORIZING LOAN FROM THE COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING, IN PART. THE SOUTH WELL-FIELD TRANSMISSION LINE PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A PROMISSORY NOTE TO EVIDENCE THE LOAN AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE NOTE FROM THE OPERATION OF THE WATER ACTIVITY **ENTERPRISE:** AND MAKING CERTAIN **COVENANTS** CONNECTION WITH THE LOAN AND PROVIDING DETAILS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the City of Lamar, Colorado, is a municipal corporation duly organized and operating as a home rule City under Article XX of the Constitution of the State of Colorado and the Home Rule Charter of the City (unless otherwise indicated, capitalized terms used in this preamble shall have the meanings set forth in Section 1 of this Ordinance); and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner and operator of a water and sewer utility (referred to in this preamble as the "System") and the City operates and maintains the System as a single public utility and income-producing project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 992 of the City, the System has been established by the City as a "water activity enterprise" within the meaning of the Water Activity Law; and

WHEREAS, the System has in recent years been operated on a self-supporting basis by the City with all revenues of the System accounted for in separate proprietary funds collectively referred to herein as the "Water Activity Enterprise Fund" and such system is considered to be a government-owned business and an "enterprise" of the City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 992 of the City, the water activity enterprise is authorized to issue bonds, notes, or other obligations payable from the revenues derived or to be derived from the System, in accordance with the Water Activity Law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined, for the benefit of the City and its inhabitants, that it is necessary to provide for the replacement of a deteriorating transmission line from one of the City's well fields to its treatment facility at an estimated cost of approximately \$1,970,000, \$200,000 of which is to be paid from a grant by the Arkansas Basin Roundtable, \$985,000 of which is to be paid from a grant from the Colorado Department of Local Affairs and the balance of which is to be paid from an approved loan from the Colorado Water Conservation Board; and

WHEREAS, the City Council the City has received the Loan Contract (identified as Loan Contract C150367) from the Colorado Water Conservation Board, an agency of the State, for a loan in an amount up to \$792,850, at an interest rate of 2.25% per annum, for a repayment term of 30 years; and

WHEREAS, the City's repayment obligations under the Loan Contract will be evidenced by Promissory Note to be issued by the City to the CWCB, which Note shall constitute a special revenue obligation of the City which is to be paid from System Net Revenues and, after consideration, the City Council has determined that the execution of the Loan Contract and the issuance of the Promissory Note to the CWCB is to the best advantage of the City; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2013, the City Council adopted Resolution 13-10-02 which, among other things, provides for the imposition and collection of a monthly Facility Investment Fee of one dollar per tap, which fee increase will, based upon the current number of water taps served by the City, be sufficient to provide for the repayment of the Promissory Note; and

WHEREAS, voter approval in advance is not required under Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution or the City Charter for the execution of the Loan Contract or the issuance of the Promissory Note; and

WHEREAS, the City has outstanding multi-year obligations which are secured by the Net Revenue and which generally consist of (i) Water Activity Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2009, dated June 10, 2009, issued in the amount of \$1,670,000 (ii) a loan from CWRPDA Drinking Water Revolving Fund, represented by a Loan Agreement dated as of December 17, 2009 and a Governmental Agency Bond in the original amount of \$1,067,625, (iii) a loan from CWRPDA Drinking Water Revolving Fund - ARRA, represented by a Loan Agreement dated as of December 19, 2009 and a Governmental Agency Bond in the original amount of \$3,952,375 and (iv) a loan from CWRPDA Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund, represented by a Loan Agreement dated as of May 27, 2010 and a Governmental Agency Bond in the original amount of \$2,000,000 (as defined below, the "Parity Lien Obligations"); and

WHEREAS, the form of the Loan Contract and related appendices have been reviewed by the City staff and made available to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to authorize the execution of the Loan Contract, the issuance and delivery of the Promissory Note, and the execution of any additional documentation which may be related to the financing; therefore,

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMAR, COLORADO:

**Section 1. Definitions**. The following terms shall have the following meanings as used in this Ordinance:

"Capital Improvements" means the acquisition of land, easements, facilities and equipment (other than ordinary repairs and replacements), and the construction or reconstruction of improvements, betterments, and extensions, for use by, or in connection with, the System.

"Charter" means the home rule Charter of the City.

"City" means the City of Lamar, Prowers County, Colorado.

"City Council" means the City Council of the City acting as the governing body of the Water Activity Enterprise.

"C.R.S." means the Colorado Revised Statutes, as amended and supplemented as of the date hereof.

"CWCB" means the Department of Natural Resources, Colorado Water Conservation Board, an executive branch agency of the State.

"CWRPDA" means the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority, a body corporate and political subdivision of the State.

"Enabling Law" means the City Charter, the Supplemental Public Securities Act, the Water Activity Law and all other laws of the State establishing the power of the City to complete the financing contemplated by this Ordinance.

"Event of Default" means any one or more of the events set forth in the Section hereof entitled "Events of Default and Remedies."

"Future Parity Obligations" means one or more series of additional bonds, notes, interim securities or other obligations issued by the City having a lien on the Net Revenue which is on a parity with the lien of the Promissory Note.

"Gross Revenue" means all fees (including but not limited to user fees and plant investment fees), charges and revenues directly or indirectly derived by the City for the services furnished by, or use of, the System, or any part thereof, including all income attributable to any future dispositions of property or rights or related contracts, settlements, or judgments held or obtained in connection with the System or its operations; provided however, that there shall be excluded from Gross Revenue (a) moneys borrowed and used for providing Capital Improvements; (b) any money and securities, and investment income therefrom, in any refunding fund, escrow account, or similar account pledged to the payment of any bonds or other obligations for the purpose of defeasing the same; and (c) any moneys received as grants or appropriations from the United States, the State of Colorado, or other sources, the use of which is limited or restricted by the grantor or donor to the provision of Capital Improvements or for other purposes resulting in the general unavailability thereof, except to the extent any such moneys shall be received as payments for the use of the System, services rendered thereby, the availability of any such service, or the disposal of any commodities therefrom.

"Loan Contract" means the contract, designated Loan Contract No. C150367, as may be amended from time to time, by and between the State for the use and benefit of the CWCB and the City.

"Net Revenue" means Gross Revenue after deducting Operation and Maintenance Expenses.

"Note Account" means the "2013 CWCB Note Account," established by the provisions hereof for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Promissory Note, including

the interest accruing under the Loan Contract prior to the accrual of interest under the Promissory Note.

"Operation and Maintenance Expenses" means all reasonable and necessary current expenses of the City, paid or accrued, for operating, maintaining, and repairing the System, including without limitation legal and overhead expenses of the City directly related to the administration of the System; provided however, that there shall be excluded from Operation and Maintenance Expenses any allowance or transfers for depreciation, payments in lieu of taxes or franchise fees, legal liabilities not based on contract, expenses incurred in connection with Capital Improvements, payments due in connection with any bonds or other obligations issued to provide Capital Improvements, and charges for the accumulation of reserves.

"Ordinance" means this Ordinance which authorizes the execution of the Loan Contract and the issuance of the Promissory Note, including any amendments properly made hereto.

"Parity Lien Obligations" means the respective loans identified in the preamble to this Ordinance as the Parity Lien Obligations which are currently outstanding and have a lien on the Net Revenue which is on a parity with the lien of the Promissory Note.

"Payment Date" means the date established pursuant to the Loan Contract for the annual payment of the principal of and interest on the Promissory Note, as set forth therein.

"Project" means the System improvements identified in the Loan Contract, which generally consist of the replacement of a deteriorating transmission line from one of the City's well fields to its treatment facility, and such other improvements as may be later approved by the City Council.

"Project Account" means the "2013 CWCB Note Project Account," established by the provisions hereof for the purpose of paying the Project Costs.

"Project Costs" means the City's costs properly attributable to the Project and permissible as "Eligible Expenses" as set forth in provision B(2) of the Loan Contract.

"Promissory Note" means the Promissory Note evidencing the City's repayment obligation from the date of substantial completion of the Project, as set forth in Appendix 2 to the Loan Contract.

"Pro Rata Portion" means the dollar amount derived by dividing the amount of principal and interest to come due on the next Payment Date by the number of monthly credits required to be made prior to such Payment Date.

"Required Reserve Amount" means the amount equal to an annual loan payment as specified for the Required Reserve Amount under Section A(8)(d) of the Loan Contract.

"Reserve Account" means a special account of the City designated as the "2013 CWCB Note Reserve Account," created by this Ordinance for the purpose of paying, if necessary, the principal of and interest on the Promissory Note.

"State" means the State of Colorado.

"Subordinate Lien Obligations" means one or more series of additional bonds, notes, interim securities or other obligations issued by the City having a lien on the Net Revenue which is subordinate or junior to the lien of the Promissory Note.

"Supplemental Public Securities Act" means Part 2 of Article 57 of Title 11, C.R.S.

"System" means all of the City's water and sewer facilities and properties, now owned or hereafter acquired, whether situated within or without the City boundaries, including all present or future improvements, extensions, enlargements, betterments, replacements, or additions thereof or thereto.

"Water Activity Enterprise" means the City of Lamar Water Activity Enterprise which has been reestablished pursuant to Ordinance No. 992 the provisions of the Water Activity Law, and the operation of which is accounted for in the Water Activity Enterprise Fund.

"Water Activity Enterprise Fund" means the City's Water Fund and the City's Sewer Fund, which are used to account for the financial operations of the Water Activity Enterprise, and any additional funds established hereafter for such purpose.

"Water Activity Law" means Title 37, Article 45.1, C.R.S.

Section 2. Approval of Loan Agreement and Authorization of Promissory Note. Pursuant to and in accordance with the State Constitution and the Enabling Law, there is hereby authorized and approved the execution of the Loan Contract. There shall be issued by the City, acting and through its Water Activity Enterprise, the Promissory Note in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$792,850, for the purpose of paying the Project Costs and other costs in connection with the Promissory Note. All covenants, statements, representations and agreements contained in the Loan Contract and the Promissory Note are hereby approved and adopted as the covenants, statements, representations and agreements of the City. The accomplishment of the Project is hereby authorized, approved and ordered and it is hereby determined that the Promissory Note matures at such time not exceeding the estimated life of the Project.

**Section 3. Form of Promissory Note.** The Promissory Note shall be in substantially the form set forth in Appendix 2 to the Loan Contract with such changes thereto, not inconsistent herewith, as may be necessary or desirable and approved by the officials of the City executing the same (whose manual or facsimile signatures thereon shall constitute conclusive evidence of such approval). The interest rate authorized for the Promissory Note is 2.25% per annum (and the maximum net effective interest rate shall not exceed 3.0% per annum), exclusive of any late charges of 5.0% of the annual payment due which may be imposed pursuant to the terms of the Loan Contract for any late payments.

#### Section 4. Fund and Accounts.

(a) Water Activity Enterprise Fund. There is hereby reaffirmed the Water Activity Enterprise Fund and there is hereby established the following accounts of the Water Activity Enterprise Fund, which shall be maintained by the City in accordance

with the provisions of this Ordinance: the Project Account; the Note Account; and the Reserve Account. The City shall keep proper books of record and accounts showing complete and correct entries of all transactions relating to the funds and accounts referred to herein and in such manner that the Gross Revenue and the Net Revenue may at all times be readily and accurately determined.

- (b) **Project Account.** All moneys received from CWCB under the Loan Contract shall be credited to the Project Account shall be applied solely to the payment of the Project Costs. Upon the determination of the Council that all Project Costs have been paid or are determinable, any balance remaining in the Project Account (less any amounts necessary to pay Project Costs not then due and owing) shall be applied solely in accordance with the terms of the Loan Contract, including without limitation provision A(5) thereof.
- (c) Note Account. Moneys in the Note Account shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the interest on and principal of the Promissory Note. Upon the determination by CWCB that the Project is substantially complete the City shall, or before the last day of each month, credit to the Note Account from the Net Revenue an amount equal to the Pro Rata Portion of the interest and principal to come due on the Promissory Note on the next succeeding Payment Date. In the event of insufficient Net Revenue, moneys shall be first applied to the payment of interest. Moneys in the Project Account also may be used to pay the interest accruing under provision A(4) of the Loan Contract prior to the completion of the Project. To the extent that moneys are not used from the final disbursement of loan funds pursuant to provision A(4) for such purpose, Net Revenues and other legally available moneys shall be credited to the Note Account prior to substantial completion of the Project in order to make said payment when due.

#### (d) Reserve Account.

- (i) Use of Moneys in the Reserve Account. Moneys in the Reserve Account shall be used, if necessary, only to prevent a default in the payment of the principal of or interest on the Promissory Note on any Payment Date and the Reserve Account is hereby pledged to the payment of the Promissory Note. In the event the amounts credited to the Note Account are insufficient to pay the principal of or interest on Promissory Note when due, the City shall transfer from the Reserve Account to the Note Account an amount which, when combined with moneys in the Note Account will be sufficient to make such payments when due.
- (ii) Funding and Maintenance of Required Reserve Amount. Commencing with the first Payment Date, the City shall annually credit an amount equal to one-tenth of the Required Reserve Amount on or before each Payment Date until such time as the amount credited thereto is equal to the Required Reserve Amount (i.e., the Reserve Account is to be fully funded within ten years from substantial completion of the Project). In the event that moneys from the Reserve Account are transferred to the Note Account as provided in paragraph (i) of this Subsection, such amount shall be replenished within 90 days from the date of such transfer. Moneys credited to the Reserve Account may be

invested or deposited in lawful securities or obligations and all interest income from the investment or reinvestment of moneys credited to the Reserve Account shall be credited to the Reserve Account until the amount therein is equal to the Required Reserve Amount, at which time as the balance of the Reserve Account shall be maintained in the Required Reserve Amount and such interest income shall be credited to the Note Account.

(e) Audits. At least once a year in the time and manner provided by law, the City will cause an audit to be performed of the records relating to the revenues and expenditures of the System. Such audit may be made part of and included within the general audit of the City, and made at the same time as the general audit. In addition, at least once a year in the time and manner provided by law, the City will cause a budget to be prepared and adopted. Copies of the budget and the audit will be filed and recorded in the places, time and manner provided by law. The City covenants to submit a copy of the annual audit and certificate of debt service coverage to the CWCB as provided in provision A(8)(f) of the Loan Contract.

#### Section 5. Security for Payment of the Promissory Note; Flow of Funds.

- (a) **Pledge of Net Revenues.** The Promissory Note shall constitute an irrevocable and first lien upon the Net Revenue, but not necessarily an exclusive first lien. The Net Revenue is hereby pledged to the payment of the Promissory Note on a parity of the lien of the Parity Lien Obligations. The creation, perfection, enforcement and priority of the pledge of revenues to secure or pay the Promissory Note shall be governed by Section 11-57-208, C.R.S. and this Ordinance. The Net Revenue shall immediately be subject to the lien of such pledge without any physical delivery, filing or further act.
- (b) Flow of Funds. The City shall credit to the Water Activity Enterprise Fund all Gross Revenue immediately upon receipt. The City shall pay from the Water Activity Enterprise Fund all Operation and Maintenance Expenses as they become due and payable. After such payment or the allocation of Gross Revenue to such payment, the City shall apply the Net Revenue in the following order of priority:

FIRST, to the credit of the Note Account, the amounts required by the Section hereof entitled "Fund and Accounts - Note Account", and to the credit of any other account or subaccount which has been or will be established for the payment of interest on and principal of the Parity Lien Obligations and any Future Parity Obligations;

SECOND, to the credit of the Reserve Account, the amounts required by the Section hereof entitled "Fund and Accounts - Reserve Account" and to the credit of any other account or subaccount which has been or will be established as a reserve account for the payment the Parity Lien Obligations and any Future Parity Obligations; THIRD, to the credit of any other fund or account hereafter established for the payment of Subordinate Lien Obligations, including any sinking fund, reserve fund or similar fund or account established therefor, the amounts required by the resolution or other enactment authorizing issuance of the Subordinate Lien Obligations; and

FOURTH, to the credit of any other fund or account as may be designated by the City, to be used for any lawful purpose, any moneys remaining in the Water Activity Enterprise Fund after the payments and accumulations set forth in FIRST through THIRD hereof.

- (c) **Promissory Note Does Not Constitute a Debt.** The Promissory Note, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable only out of: (i) the Note Account; or (ii) if necessary, the Reserve Account. The CWCB may not look to the general fund of the City for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Promissory Note, and the Loan Contract and the Promissory Note shall not constitute a debt or an indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory provision or limitation; nor shall they be considered or held to be general obligations of the City.
- **Section 6. Additional Obligations.** No bonds, notes, interim securities or other obligations shall be issued payable from the Net Revenue and having a lien thereon which is superior to the lien of the Promissory Note. The City may issue Future Parity Obligations only upon compliance with the requirements of provision A(8)(e) of the Loan Contract. So long as no Event of Default shall have occurred and be continuing, nothing herein shall prevent the City from issuing Subordinate Lien Obligations.

#### Section 7. Additional Covenants and Agreements.

- (a) Maintenance of Rates and Coverage. The City hereby covenants that it will establish, maintain, enforce and collect rates, fees and charges for services furnished by or the use of the System as required in provision A(8)(c) of the Loan Contract. In the event that the Gross Revenue at any time is not sufficient to make the payments required by said provision, the City covenants to promptly increase such rates, fees and charges to an extent which will ensure compliance with said covenant.
- (b) Alienation of Property. The City will not sell or alienate any of the property constituting any part or all of the System in any manner or to any extent as might reduce the security provided for the payment of the Promissory Note, but the City may sell any portion of such property which shall have been replaced by other similar property of at least equal value, or which shall cease to be necessary for the efficient operation of the System; provided however, that the proceeds of any such sale of property shall be included as part of the Gross Revenue.
- (c) *Enterprise Status.* The City has established, and covenants to continue to maintain, the System as an "enterprise" within the meaning of Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and Ordinance No. 992 of the City; provided, however, after calendar year 2013 the City may disqualify either the System as an "enterprise" in any

year in which said disqualification does not materially, adversely affect the enforceability of the covenants made pursuant to this Ordinance. In the event that the System is disqualified as an enterprise and the enforceability of the covenants made pursuant to this Ordinance are materially, adversely affected, the City covenants to immediately take all actions necessary to (i) qualify the System as an enterprise within the meaning of Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and (ii) permit the enforcement of the covenants made herein.

- (d) *Findings of the City Council.* The City Council, having been fully informed of and having considered all the pertinent facts and circumstances, hereby finds, determines, declares and covenants with the CWCB that:
  - (i) The Water Activity Enterprise has been duly established and is operating during the current calendar year as an "enterprise" within the meaning of Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution;
  - (ii) the City Council elects to apply all of the provisions of Title 11, Article 57, Part 2, C.R.S. to the execution of the Loan Contract and to the issuance of the Promissory Note; and
  - (iii) the execution of the Loan Contract and the issuance and delivery of the Promissory Note, and all procedures undertaken incident thereto, are in full compliance and conformity with all applicable requirements, provisions and limitations prescribed by the Constitution and the Enabling Law, and all conditions and limitations of the Enabling Law and other applicable law relating to the execution of the Loan Contract and the issuance and delivery of the Promissory Note have been satisfied.

#### Section 8. Events of Default and Remedies.

- (a) **Events of Default.** The occurrence or existence of any one or more of the following events shall be an Event of Default hereunder:
  - (i) payment of the principal of or interest on the Promissory Note is not made by the City when due; or
  - (ii) the City defaults in the performance of any other of its covenants in this Ordinance, and such default continues for 30 days after written notice from CWCB specifying such default.
- (b) Remedies for Events of Default. Upon the occurrence and continuance of an Event of Default, the CWCB may protect and enforce its rights by proper legal or equitable remedy deemed most effectual including mandamus, specific performance of any covenants, injunctive relief or requiring the City Council to act as if it were the trustee of an express trust, or any combination of such remedies.
- **Section 9. Approval of Documents**. The Mayor (or in the Mayor's absence the Mayor Pro Tem) and City Clerk shall, and they are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions

necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Ordinance, including, but not limited to, the execution of the Loan Contract, the Promissory Note, the Security Agreement (as set forth in Appendix 2 to the Loan Contract) and such additional agreements, certificates and affidavits as may be reasonably required. The execution by the Mayor of the City of any document authorized herein shall be conclusive proof of the approval by the City of the terms thereof.

- **Section 10. Amendment of Ordinance**. This Ordinance may be amended only with the prior written consent of CWCB.
- **Section 11. Limitation of Actions**. In accordance with Section 11-57-212, C.R.S., no legal or equitable action can be brought with respect to any legislative acts or proceedings in connection with the authorization and execution of the Loan Contract or issuance and delivery of the Promissory Note more than 30 days after the date of passage of this Ordinance.
- **Section 12. Ratification of Prior Actions**. All actions heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance) by the City Council or by the officers and employees of the City directed toward the issuance of the Promissory Note for the purposes herein set forth are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.
- **Section 13. Headings**. The headings to the various sections and paragraphs to this Ordinance have been inserted solely for the convenience of the reader, are not a part of this Ordinance, and shall not be used in any manner to interpret this Ordinance.
- **Section 14. Ordinance Irrepealable**. After the Promissory Note has been issued, this Ordinance shall constitute a contract between CWCB and the City, and shall be and remain irrepealable until the Promissory Note and the interest accruing thereon shall have been fully paid, satisfied and discharged, as herein provided.
- **Section 15. Severability**. It is hereby expressly declared that all provisions hereof and their application are intended to be and are severable. In order to implement such intent, if any provision hereof or the application thereof is determined by a court or administrative body to be invalid or unenforceable, in whole or in part, such determination shall not affect, impair or invalidate any other provision hereof or the application of the provision in question to any other situation; and if any provision hereof or the application thereof is determined by a court or administrative body to be valid or enforceable only if its application is limited, its application shall be limited as required to most fully implement its purpose.
- **Section 16. Repealer.** All orders, bylaws, resolutions and ordinances of the City, or parts thereof, inconsistent or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency or conflict.
- **Section 17. Effective Date; Recording and Authentication.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect 30 days after publication, following final passage. This Ordinance shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, shall be authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and the City Clerk, and shall be published in accordance with law.

### PROCLAMATION NO. 13-07

# A PROCLAMATION DECLARING THE 16 DAYS BETWEEN INTERNATIONAL DAY TO ELIMINATE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ON NOVEMBER 25TH AND INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS DAY ON DECEMBER 10TH AS THE 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER VIOLENCE

WHEREAS, We, as citizens of this community, recognize the worldwide problem of violence against women occurs even here in Lamar, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, Gender violence is traumatic to the body, mind, and spirit and can prevent people from being fully active participants at home and in the world; and

WHEREAS, The health of parents and caregivers is critical to the overall health and wellbeing of their families and the larger community; and

WHEREAS, Gender violence costs the nation billions of dollars annually in medical expenses, police and court costs, shelters and foster care, sick leave, absenteeism and non-productivity; and

WHEREAS, In spite of some progress, we need only to look at our newspapers or watch a television newscast to see the unfortunate truth that gender violence has not yet been eliminated here in Lamar, nor around the world; and

WHEREAS, We support efforts of individuals and organizations to raise awareness, stimulate discussion, and advocate for local solutions that will curb gender violence; and

WHEREAS, These local people join thousands of others from around the world to assert that the right of women and men to be free of violence is a fundamental human right.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Mayor, Roger Stagner, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Lamar, Colorado, do hereby proclaim the 16 days between International Day to Eliminate Violence Against Women on November 25th and International Human Rights Day on December 10th as the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence. During these 16 days, all citizens are urged to support work to end gender violence and to eliminate the detrimental consequences gender violence has on the wellbeing of our community.

BACKGROUND:			

Upon the passing of new laws pertaining to collective bargaining by the State of Colorado Legislature in the summer of 2013 the Lamar City Council directed staff to transition our part-time fire department members back to volunteer status with the understanding that stipends could and would continue to be paid. After researching policies from the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor (Fair Labor Standards Act) we have created a policy that allows for small stipend payments to our volunteer firefighting staff for attendance to trainings and structure fires (as before) without jeopardizing their volunteer classification. The Policy is attached for review.

This policy does not pertain to our EMS system as those responders are still classified as part-time employees. Volunteer firefighters who also serve as EMS providers would receive stipends for fire-related activities under this policy but would also be paid for their EMS activities as part-time employees.

Volunteer firefighters will accrue pension benefits via the Fire and Police Pension Association if minimum annual participation standards are met.

Contributions are made to Social Security for part-time EMS providers.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the Lamar City Council approve this new stipend policy to go into effect on January 1, 2014.

# Lamar Fire Department Volunteer Firefighter Stipend Policy

All members of the Lamar Fire Department classified as volunteers are eligible for stipends based on the following criteria.

#### 1. Trainings

a. Fire trainings attended by the volunteer firefighter will be paid at a flat rate of \$16.00 per training session regardless of the length or duration of the training session

#### 2. Fire response

- a. Volunteer firefighters will receive stipends only for attendance to structure fires.
- b. Structure fires are defined as fires that actually involve a structure itself to include residential buildings, commercial and industrial buildings, garages and outbuildings regardless of origin of fire.
- c. Structure fires do not include fires involving the contents of buildings where the fire does not spread to the structure itself. These include furniture, appliances and other contents.
- d. For the purpose of determining stipend amounts responses are broken into two definitions.
  - i. Initial response.
    - 1. Each volunteer firefighter who responds to assist on an initial response to a structure fire shall receive a \$16.00 stipend.
  - ii. Extended response.
    - 1. When an initial response exceeds two hours in duration it shall be classified as an extended response.
    - 2. Each firefighter participating in an extended response shall receive an additional flat \$10.00 stipend and is not based on a per-hour basis.

#### 3. Miscellaneous

- a. This policy is limited to volunteer firefighters only. Ambulance staff members are classified as part-time employees and are subject to a different City of Lamar pay policy
  - i. In the event that a volunteer firefighter also serves as a part-time ambulance provider then the volunteer firefighter will receive stipends for structure fire response and fire trainings following this policy and will receive pay for ambulance responses as a part-time ambulance responder following the City of Lamar paid employee policies.
  - ii. The volunteer firefighter shall be eligible to accrue service credit through the volunteer firefighter pension plan provided that minimum requirements for service credit have been met.

iii. For Volunteer firefighters also serving as part-time ambulance responders contributions will also be made into Social Security.

## b. Withholding

 i. Volunteer firefighter stipends are subject to all applicable taxes. The City of Lamar will withhold taxes on all stipends as required by state and Federal laws.

BACKGROUND:		

Bids were opened on Thursday November 7, 2013 for the Reconstruction of the Apron Edge and Taxi way, and construction of a Fuel Spill Prevention Basin at the Lamar Airport. Two bids were received for the project. Concrete Works was the low bidder at \$619,980. NORAA Concrete submitted a bid of

\$764,852. The low bid is \$228,337 below the engineer's estimate of \$848,317.

The project will include reconstruction of a portion of the Apron and Taxiway in concrete along with the construction of a concrete fuel spill containment basin near the fuel farm.

The City's in kind portion of the project will involve the demolition of the spill containment area. The cash match for the Apron Rehabilitation project is CDOT 7.5% or \$58,374 and City of Lamar 2.5% or \$19,458

Staff recommends awarding the Bid for schedule I and II of AIP Project Number 3-08-0036-18-2013 to Concrete Works of Colorado for the amount of \$619,980

We have received the bid tabulation and reviewed the bid documents. We concur with your recommendation to award this project to Concrete Works of Colorado, for the amount of \$619,980.00. The FAA participation will be limited to Schedule I work as referenced above. The amount for Schedule I construction is \$562,050.00. Furthermore, we accept your statement that the cost is reasonable based on any price/cost analysis performed by you or your consultant. Please maintain a copy of your price/cost analysis for future audit purposes.

The approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goal for this project was 3.0 percent and Colorado Concrete Works has indicated they will meet this goal.

You are reminded that your Disadvantage Business Enterprise (DBE) Accomplishments reports are due annually on December 1 for the previous Fiscal Year. Accomplishments can be submitted either through the Office of Civil Rights DOORS system at: http://osdbu.dot.gov/DOORS/Application/logon.aspx, or by completing the Uniform Report of DBE Awards/Commitments and Payments form and submitting via email. If you need a DOORS user account, please contact your local Civil Rights contact

Please provide this office with the following documents:

1. One copy of the executed contract with Concrete Works of Colorado.

- 2. Copies of the payment and performance bonds and the Power of Attorney for the person signatory to the bonds. This information will not be required if you certify that these documents meet the contract requirements of state and local law.
- 3. A copy of the Notice to Proceed so we will be aware of the beginning construction date. This should be provided only after the sponsor determines that all necessary contracts, bonds, certificates of insurance, etc., and Safety Plan Compliance Documents are satisfactory, so that a Notice to Proceed may be issued to the contractor.

FAA regulations require the sponsor notify us in writing that adequate construction supervision and inspection have been arranged to ensure construction conforms to the approved plans and specifications. To do this, the sponsor must review the qualifications of the various people who will be performing the supervision and inspection. Your resident engineer and inspectors must be familiar with the specification requirements and perform testing as required. This action should be documented in your construction management program for this contract.

A preconstruction conference should be scheduled. Please inform us of the time and place of this meeting (at least 10 days in advance). The contractor's construction schedule and the overall project should be discussed. We will attend this meeting and discuss applicable Federal laws. If we are unable to attend the preconstruction conference, we request a copy of the minutes of the meeting and a list of those in attendance be provided to our office.

Copies of all test results should be available, during construction, at the job site for our review. In addition, Construction Progress and Inspection Reports, using FAA Form 5370-1 must be submitted on a weekly basis during construction.

Changes to the plans and specifications should be made by change order or supplemental agreement. Approval by the FAA should be obtained prior to performing the work to be eligible for participation.

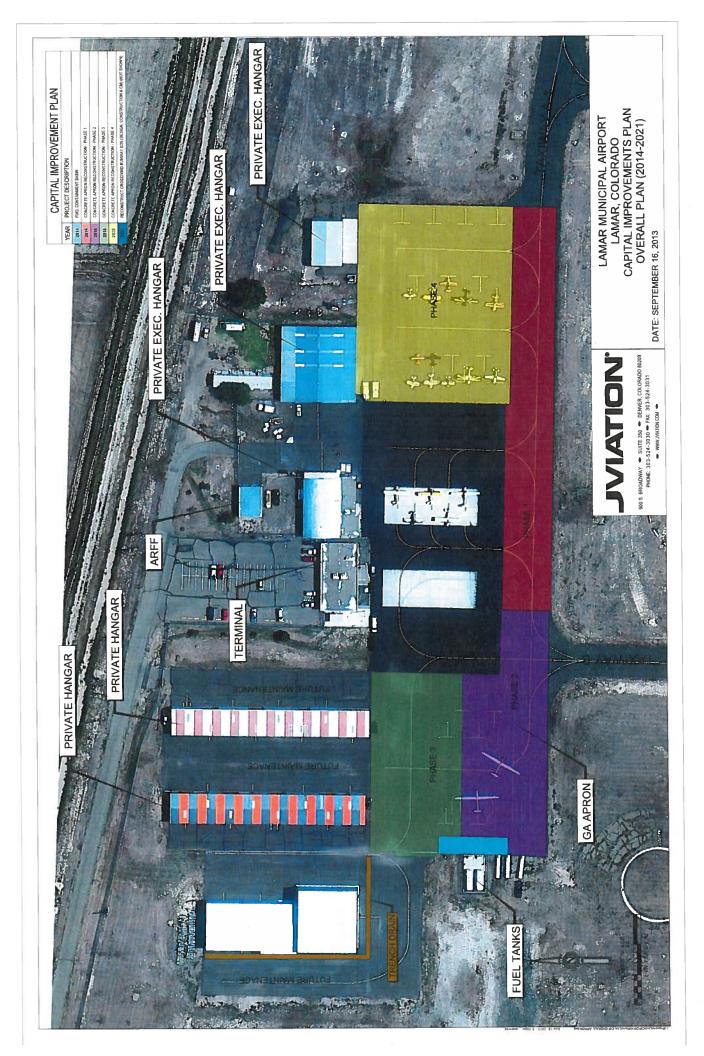
